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### Instructional Activity #1.0 (Domestic Violence – Primary Aggressor)

**Purpose of Activity:** This is a facilitated, large group activity that is designed to develop the students' skills at identifying "Primary Aggressors" during a Domestic Violence investigation. The instructor should emphasize the most common identifiers when determining who the primary aggressor is.

**Activity Description:** The class will watch a video of an act of Domestic Violence. As a class, brainstorm and identify the acts / actions / retaliations of the role players. As a class, make a determination as to which the "Primary Aggressor" was and provide evidence as to why.

**Key Learning Points:**

- Provide student with the ability to recognize different acts of aggression / defense during a DV incident.
- Proper techniques in investigating Domestic Violence incidents.
- Provided student with the ability to survey the scene for evidence to support Victim / Suspect statements.

- DVD player.
